Uniform Policy Update: An amended policy to provide clarity for the wearing of earrings and jewellery was approved by Governors, after we discovered that our published policy did not cover some important safety factors.

After Easter, our policy for jewellery and earrings will be:

Jewellery is not permitted in school for safety reasons, other than earrings; children may only wear one pair of small, plain stud earrings. If children come to school wearing earrings on P.E. or swimming days they will have to take the earrings out themselves or, for P.E., cover them with micropore tape which should be brought in from home.

The safety aspect of using tape to cover earrings will be determined by the teacher depending on the nature of the planned activities. Children risk being excluded from P.E. if earrings which cannot be removed or covered with tape are judged to create a potential safety risk.

The National guidance has always been that no jewellery should be worn in PE and that includes swimming and physical activity. Expectations for jewellery at Lindhead School follow best practice and consider the requirement to avoid discrimination in line with the Equality Act 2010.

Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence.

They feel they can't turn to parents or a trusted adult for support as they fear they may get in trouble or have their devices taken away from them. It can carry on all day, all evening and all weekend for the world to see, causing a lot of emotional stress to the victim and their family.



It can very quickly lead to the victim feeling trapped, scared and vulnerable to grooming and blackmail.
